#### PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Thank you all for supporting us as we moved again on Monday into COVID-19 Alert Level 2. Let's hope it's a quick fix. I will keep you up to date as soon as I can with any further developments. Remember to scan or sign in if you are coming into the school grounds. Students are not permitted on site until 8.30am at this level and we will bring them to the gate to meet you at 3.00pm. We've altered the play/eat times at interval and lunchtime so we can monitor hand washing.

When we are able to go back to Level 1, we are slightly altering after school arrangements to maximise safety for our students. They will be allowed to play on the upper adventure playground and court only until the bell rings at 3.10pm. At this time they must come and sit outside the office area with their bags to wait for pick-up. Parents can only take their children to other parts of the playground to play after the bell has been rung. Children playing after the bell must be actively supervised by their own parents unless another parent is actually taking them home. It has become nearly impossible for staff to work out who is waiting for their parents to arrive.


Friday (19 February) is hopefully the annual PTA
