PROFESSIONAL LEARNING & DEVELOPMENT

Turitea School is a member of Te Oro Karaka Kāhui Ako (Community of Learning) and our Professional Learning and Development focus this year is on Culturally Responsive and Relational Pedagogy. As part of our professional responsibilities, school leaders are always interested to understand more about whanau views and experiences of student learning in their classroom and school, as well as whānau perceptions of their experiences when in contact with school. This survey is an opportunity to collect whanau views. There are questions that ask about how school is for Māori students and for Māori whānau. This is so we can make sure that we are providing inclusive and equitable teaching and learning. We are also getting our teachers and our older students to answer a version of this survey so we can see everyone's perspective. All are asked for their perspective about their experiences, irrespective of cultural location/identity. School leaders will then put into place some evidence-based actions in response to this student, staff and whānau perception data collected.
